


69%

of respondents believed Abilene was positioned to move forward with reopening


### TOP FIVE FACTORS FOR THE STATE TO CONSIDER IN REOPENING THE TEXAS ECONOMY.

## SUPPORT SMALL BUSINESS TO RE-OPEN

## ADVICE FOR TASK FORCE

#### A COMMON THEME AROUND THIS QUESTION:

Clearly communicate, if our economy doesn't open soon businesses won't survive, act responsibly, need more testing, follow social distancing guidelines, allow local communities to decide course of action,

Advice to local leaders related to reopening the local economy: enforcing CDC requirements, get back to work but make sure you do it carefully, give people the choice, reopen in phases

A common theme around gyms: require constant cleaning, no group fitness classes, remove 24 hour access so facilities can properly sanitize, use at your own risk type of opening.

Lead time on reopening varied greatly from business to business. The least amount of time stated was none business could open now with the most amount of time being one month.
